

(continued from page 1) I did a load of wash and then went over the hill to Waterville where my sister Ruth works and stayed there about an hour. Came back and went to the village store for some N.Y. cheese to bring home.

Meanwhile my aunt was getting lunch and we both were wondering how the boys were making out and when they'd be back. Phone Rang and it was some more friends Joe and Margaret Kidd. They knew we were there cause Jeff called Joe about a water pump. They came down from Bouckville and were there about twenty minutes when Bill and Jeff came home.

With water pump on, tires changed, oil changed and greased, Jeff looks at me and asked shall we start back now or wait until morning? I had to drive the truck and it was after 2:80 PM then, I said "in the morning"!

Things slowed down a bit and the lunch my aunt had been fussing over and keeping warm was eaten, and we had more time to talk with Joe and Margaret.

Late that afternoon, Jeff And I went to New Hartford to see if we could get some apples to bring home. On the way we remembered the anniversary party and decided to attend on the way back, in Franklin Springs, our hometown.

We arrived around 6:00 PM and there were about 100 people we hadn't seen in 22 years, there was hardly a stranger in the house. Acting Editor Frank Ambrogio, announced that he mailed out 82 issues of Greasy Prints. This was a smaller mailing because he did not mail to any member who did not renew his membership. By Streamlining the Newsletter, he was able to reduce the issue to 5 pages and the mailing cost to \$.22. This saved about \$12.00 from the November cost.

Thanks to Larry Golub, Frank got in touch with Bill Pelick, who printed our membership cards, and made arrangements for Bill to print our Newsletter for about \$30.00. The previous 2 issues cost \$60.00 and \$55.00 to print. Combining this with our lower postage, it will cost us only about \$11.00 a month more to print and mail the Newsletter than when Ruth was doing it for us.

Frank announced that at the last Board meeting, it was decided to only accept Business Card ads for the Newsletter from now on. These ads are still \$15.00 per year. Dwight reported that he had talked to member Robert Kafka who was displeased that we did not accept his offer to use his home for our Christmas Party. We would like to express our APOLOGIES to Robert and hope he will forgive us. With the shuffling of Officers we have had recently, the info was never received by the right people. It is unfortunate that the Christmas Party plans were shelved because we THOUGHT we did not have a site for the party.

Richard Green asked about ordering a supply of club hats and shirts. It was decided to order 12 hats.

Dwight announced that it will probably be February before Studebakers lounge opens at Loehmanns Plaza.

Paul and Marion White will bring the goddies for the next meeting.

Wayne and Joan Thomas have moved into a home in Holly Hill after 12 years in their trailer. Congratulations to these two who travel the farthest each month to make it to our meetings.

Dwight Swanson Jr. (in absentia) won the 50/50 prize and split \$14.00.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 pm.

1 cup sour creen, scales

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup sergarine, seltes

2. packages dry yeast 1/2 cup warm water 2. eggs, besten 4. cups all purpose flour

Combine scalded sour creen, sugar, margarine and salt. Hix well and let cool to lubouers. Dissolve yeast in warn water in a large mixing boulg stir in sour creen mixture, then eggs. Gradually stir in flour (dough will be soft). Cover tightly and chill eversight.

Bivide daugh into 4 equal portions. Turn each portion out on a heavily floured surface and kneed 4 or 5 times. Boll each into a 12x8 inch rectangle. Spread eac-fourth of filling over each rectangle, leaving a half inch sargin around edges. Carefully roll up jellyreli fashion, beginning at long side. Firmly pinch edge and ends to seel. Carefully place rolls, seen side down on greeced baking shoots.

Hake 6 equally spaced X-shaped cuts across top of each loaf. Cover and let rise in a warm draft-free place until doubled in bulk (about 1 hour). Bake at 375 for 15-20 minutes. Spread loaves with glaze while warm.

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
Dear Greasy Prints Editor:




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

### Studebaker and other car makers that didn't make it

Se the Chrysler Corp. has made it through its crisis and is now operating in the black. Corporate head man Lee Iacocca pulled some rabbits out of his hat, got enough federal bail-out backing to see the company through the really rough spots and the company is back to business as usual.

But being an old Hudson man at heart, I can't help but wonder what the car market would be like today if those American auto mak-ers who also faced hard time but went down the tubes had gotten

went down the tubes has gotten help from our Uncle Sam. There were lots of them, too. Since the automobile business started more than 100 years ago, there's been nearly 3,000 brand names from which American buy-

ers could choose.

And it wasn't always the ascient names that took the deep six, either. Since the end of World War either. Since the end of World War II, there's been several big outfliss that either disappeared or were absorbed by another auto maker. Some were old-line and presti-gious; some were fairly new and brash. It might be interesting now to review some of those former Boulevard Beasts, their back-recounts and why they have some grounds and why they have gone to that Vehicular Valhalia in the

Sky, Here's the post-war casual-ties that I remember best:
PACKARD — "Ask the man who owns one" was the slegan of this very high class and expensive car. It survived the depression but only by the skin of its teeth. It was only by the stin of its teeth. It was easily on a par with the Cadillac and the Lincols but had no breadand-butter line to carry it through the rough spots. After more than half a century of building cars for the upper-crust, Packard did its last production line in 1958. For quality, you can still ask the man (or woman) who owned one — at least before 1957!

STUDEBAKER — This horse-frawn wagon maker began makers.

drawn wagon maker began making low and mid-priced cars shortly after the turn of the century. They were interesting, reliable and for the most part, rather duil. The exceptions came late in its life when it began producing a myriad of beautiful Speedster and Hawk models and the timeless (and still produced in its original body de-sign) Avanti. The company made a valiant effort to regroup in Cana-da but by 1987, it was all over for

ugeraser. HUDSON — Who can forget the step-down design of the Hudson Hornet of the pavement scorching performance of its Twin H-Power big six cylinder engine, Hudson

had always been something of a leader in design, having been around since the early days, too. The pressure of post-war competi-tion lead the company into the dis-asterous production of the small-but-homely Jet which drained the company. A merger with Nash which became American Motors culminated with the Hudson nam being attached to one of the ugliest cars ever built. Hudson was put out of its misery in 1957, as I

DESOTO — Chrysler has been in trouble before this last go-around and its second-from-the-top DeSoto fell victim to low sales in '61. More than two million webtin '61. More than two million vehi-cles carried the name during its 33 years of production. A little better than the Dodge but not quite so nice as the Chrysler, it couldn't hold its own with the likes of Buick and Oldsmobile.

and Oldsmobile.
EDGEL — Not too many cars have become synonymous with failure but Ford managed it with the Edsel. It was overpriced, over promoted and undersold. Not a bad car but just produced at the wrong time. Buyers either wanted a Ford, a Lincoln — or settled for a GM product. After three years ('58 to '60), the Edsel was no more.

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ADDITIONAL CHARGE

Old Cars Weekly recently published the list of "Milestone Cars" certified by the Milestone Car Society of Indianapolis and more recently in the Jan 2, 1986 edition indicated that MCS had added 7 more automobiles to the list of post war Milestone Cars. The cars are evaluated on styling, engineering, performance, innovation, and craftmanship.

I thought it might be interesting to examine this list a little more closely just to see who did what and also to see how Studebaker fared. There were quite a few things that caught my eye after only a few minutes.

The addition of two Mercedes-Benz models pushed their number to 11 times on the list. This allowed them to surpass Jaguar which had held the lead with 18, starting in 1945 with the XK128 and ending with the E TYPE cars of 1961-1967.

Some of the nameplates I expected to see most often appeared far fewer times while other lesser known cars or cars with a shorter production life span made quite a few appearances.

Chevrolet made the list only 4 times, the same number as Plymouth, while its chief competitor Ford had a far more respectable 7 entries. Cadillac also appeared 7 times and Lincoln put in 4 appearances along with one Continental Mark II. Corvair, with a production run of only 10 years, had 3 cars on the list, the same number as both Chrysler and Mercury, and only one less than it's big brother, Chevrolet. The Corvair appeared more often than such familiar names as Buick, Dodge, Farrari, Hudson, Pontiac, and Porsche each of which had only 2 entries.

The biggest surprise to me was the Kaiser, a company which produced cars for only 9 years. No less than 6 Kaisers made the Milestone list, one more than Oldsmobile which placed 5 cars on the list. Kaiser had some nice looking cars including the Darrin, Dragon, Vagabond, Manhattan, and Virginian.

Cars appearing only one time included AMX, Bentley, BMW, Frazer, Nash, Tucker, Willys, Rolls-Royce, DeSoto, Excalibur II, Continental, Crosley, and DeSoto to name just a few.

There were 5 Packards on the list, 4 during the Studebaker/Packard marriage, tying it with Oldsmobile and putting it one ahead of Chevrolet.

Our Studebaker did itself proud by appearing on the list no less than 7 times with the 1955 President Speedster being the last to make the list in 1984. Only Jaguar and Mercedes placed more cars on the list putting Studebaker tied with Cadillac and Ford as the third most listed car makes. Other Studebaker models making the list were the 1963-1964 Avanti, 1962-1964 Gran Turismo Hawk, 1947-1949 Starlight Coupe, 1953-1954 Starlight Coupe and Starliner Hardtop, and the 1947-1949 convertibles. Conspicuous by their absence were the 1956-1958 Golden Hawks.

This is certainly not a scientific research project on my part and does not totally tell the story. For instance the Chevrolet Corvette is listed only 1 time, but includes 18 model years of cars while any Studebaker listed covers no more than a 3 year period. I simply counted the number of times the nameplate appeared.

I think it is kind of interesting that some of the Independents did quite well. Studebaker, Kaiser, and Packard all long gone from the automotive arena, are right up there with many of the more glamorous nameplates.

I'm sure you have all heard the expression, "he was ahead of his time". It is most often said in retrospect of someone who never received the acclaim he deserved until it was too late to do him any good. The same thing was said many times of companies like Studebaker. Unfortunately, being ahead of your time quite often leads to failure rather than success.

In the automobile business, being ahead of the competition seems to be the key to success. Rather than producing a product that is "ahead of its time", it is better be the first with "an idea whose time has come". The Lark was an idea whose time had come, but Studebaker did not have the resources to capitalize on their advantage.

The Tucker was ahead of its time. The Henry-J was also ahead of its time. The Ford Model T was an idea whose time had come. The results speak for themselves.

HORE GREASINESS...

My Hawk was giving me fits with sticking carb floats, which I blamed on alcohol gasoline additives washing 25± years of slime out of my gas tank. I wanted to add a fuel filter without cutting the steel gas line. Here's how it's done on most Studebakers:

- 1) Remove the inlet nipple from the fuel pump.
- 2) Replace the nipple with a fuel filter for a '77-'78 Ford or Merc V-8 (Fram# G-3428A, or Ace# G-473).

Both the filter and the nipple have a 5/16" gas hose connection on one end and a 1/8" pipe thread connection on the other end.






TURNING THE CORNER BY PRESIDENT - Frank Ambrogio

This month's profile is on Oliver and Evelyn Graham.

Oliver was born on November 3, 1920 in Pine City, Minnesota. He attended high school in Umatilla, Florida and attended the University of Florida for 5 years earning AA, BSBA, and MBA Degrees. He was a Special Agent for the FBI in Washington, D.C.. His hobbies, besides old cars, include old records, old radio programs and transcriptions. Oliver served in the U.S. Coast Guard during world war II and worked as a Control Supervisor and W.I.P. Supervisor of Property Control at Electric Boat Division of General Dynamics, home of the "Nautilus".

Evelyn was born August 20, 1920 in Westerly, Rhode Island where she attended Westerly High School. She trained and worked at Westerly Hospital for 37 years as a Licensed Practical Nurse. She enjoys knitting, ceramics, photography and serves as a band hostess for their 35 piece concert band.

Oliver and Evelyn met in Rhode Island at the Westerly Roller Skating rink while Oliver was stationed at the Watch Hill Coast Guard Station at Watch Hill, Rhode Island. They were married at the United Congregational Church in Pawcatuck, Connecticut on June 16, 1945. They have one son, John Laurence, born on November 10, 1948.

When asked how they became interested in Studebakers, Oliver said they purchased 3 Studebakers off the dealer showroom floor. The first was a 1953 from a dealer in Washington, R.I., Then came a 1956 purchased from Panciera Motors in Westerly. The Grahams currently have a 1965 Studebaker Commander 4 door which they also purchased new from Panciera Motors. They use the '65 every day and it shows 186,000 miles on the odometer. Oliver says "I think our judgement was vindicated". It would be pretty hard to argue that point.

The Grahams have the Cameron-Graham Memorial Band Library located one mile North of Altoona, Florida on SR-19. This is the only one of its kind anywhere around. Visitors are welcome - no charge.

Sounds to me like this would make a great Chapter activity to meet the Grahams and visit the Library.

## Avanti Lives Again

Mike Kelly, a former South Bend resident living in Dallas. has purchased all assets and rights to the Avanti Motor Corp.

Kelly took over on Wednesday, April 30.

Avanti Motors had declared Chapter 11 bankruptcy in the fall of 1985. Then president Stephen Blake tried many proposed re-organization schemes, but none of them fell into place. Blake resigned as president of Avanti several months ago.

South Bend's First Source Bank, principal loan holder, took over and offered the assets and rights to the Avanti name to the highest bidder, Mike Kelly of Dallas.

Old Cars Weekly talked with Kelly about the New Avanti Corp. Kelly announced that

South He also put to rest the persistant rumor that the body dies had been altered to produce a convertible and that the original Avanti coupe could no longer be built. Not only will the coupe be built, but it will be available in three distinct models. One will be the original coupe, the second will be what Kelly calls a "touring coupe," and the third model will be the performance-oriented GT model. A fourth model, the new convertible, will round out the lineup.

The present plans call for a 20-dealer base across the country. Kelly said they are looking for dealers of the "exotic, luxury-type automobiles to market the Avanti."

Once production is underway, Kelly expects to have about 100

parts sales would start immediately. In addition, production of the '87 Avanti is slated for public introduction in September. Prototype models of the coupe and new Avanti convertible are expected to be completed by the end of July.

Kelly stressed the need for upgrading the interior of the' automobile to reflect the needs of today's luxury sports car buyers. He said that interior changes will take place to emphasize "the soft luxury" people expect from a low production personal car.

employees working in the century-old building in South Bend. He looks to re-hire many of the former employees who have quality as their first priority.

Kelly, 36 years old, is president and owner of Lorwen Industries, a Euless, Texas builder and operator of ethanol plants. He grew up in South Bend and started a Corvette customizing shop in the early '70s, where he helped build the first Corvette "station wagon." After selling the shop in '76, Kelly started a van customizing business with a network of 50 licensed dealers.

When asked why he bought Avanti and plunged himself into the world of auto manufacturing, Kelly said, "Avanti was profitable before, and it can be again. Besides, there is a bit of romance involved with the Avanti, and I want to be a part of it."







## TECHNICAL TIP SHUTTING DOWN THE HEAT - by Frank Ambrogio

Since none of the real mechanics in our Chapter have offered to share any of their wisdom and experience with the rest of us, I decided to take matters into my own hands and offer up something I tried with good success. As most of you know, I can't tell a flywheel from a fly swatter so rest assured this is a job anyone can handle.

I am sure that most of you have read about the problem, most recently discussed by Jon Myer in the June 1986 issue of TURNING WHEELS. As Jon explains, on many hawks up until 1962 and many earlier cars with under seat heaters, no matter what you try you can't stop the heat from coming through. He states that the problem is that the air delivery hose, from under the front passenger fender or at the firewall, is most likely broken. This is that fat hose that looks like the the vent hose used on most clothes dryers except that this is black and much thicker. The same material as used on your new car's air cleaner.

What happens is that HOT air (and exhaust fumes) from the engine compartment enters this hose at the broken area and then comes out through the under the seat heater core into the car.

You can re-read Jon's TW article on page 50 as to how this system was designed to work and you can now order reproduction hoses from several of the vendors who advertise in TURNING WHEELS.

If you are not looking for concours points, I have a cheaper suggestion to remedy this problem which I feel will outlast the life of the car.

I went to the local Scottys store and purchased a package of 4" X 8 ft. metal flexible ducting which is used for clothes dryers, heating, cooling and ventilating equipment. The price was \$5.95 and the one I used is manufactured by DUNDAS JAFINE INC. of Buffalo, New York.

The ducting is collapsed to a length of about 3 feet and I simply ripped out the old hose and replaced it with the new metal ducting. I did not cut the ducting at all but merely attached (using the old band clamps) one end to the under the seat heater core and then streached the ducting the extra foot or so to reach the blower under the fender. I figured that by not cutting the ducting, it would be stronger and more resistant to stones and other road debris. If I get tired of the bright aluminum finish, I may spray it with one of the undercoats now available (this could be a way to fool the judges).

After the job was completed, I took the Golden Hawk out for a ride and I knew I had succeeded in shutting down the heat.

Dear Ms. Wilcoxson:

I've received a request from Paul White, for additional comments, following my letter of April 1st to your attention, wherein I objected to publication of comments about our firm that suggested impropriety without first having yourself, as Editor, investigate the situation.

Understand, that my objection is not with the minutes of the Chapter Meeting or with the right of any Chapter member to say what he or she thinks; but rather, my objection is with the <u>publication</u> of those minutes, in such a way as to suggest wrong doing, without your own query as to our side of the story.

The statement in the minutes, by Mr. White, that we no longer had the engine he ordered is correct, as is the statement in the minutes, by Mr. Swanson, that the transmission he inquired about was priced at \$1200.00. Associating those stories, in your Chapter Newsletter, with the words "mysteriously" and "price fixing" suggests that we are involved in some shady practices. It is this suggestion that I resent and which prompted my letter to you of April 1st.

And now for the specifics, as best I understand them:

Sometime back, Paul White called and requested that we have available, for his pick-up, one of our 105 c.i.d. (cubic inch displacement), 5 cyl., Engine Kits. Our 185 c.i.d., 6 cyl., Engine Kit was made by taking our basic 170 c.i.d. Engine Kit and providing the pistons and crankshaft, as required for the 185 Kit. Except for the pistons and crankshaft, the engines are the same. Unfortunately, at about the time of Mr. White's order, our stock of the pistons, necessary to make the 185 Kit, became depleted. As we operate out of a several hundred thousand sq. ft. warehouse complex, housing over 20,000 different Studebaker part numbers, we were not aware, at the time of his order, that the 185 c.i.d. pistons were all gone. As an alternative we were able then, and still are able, to offer the 170 c.i.d. Engine Kit; but Mr. White elected not to purchase

the 170 Kit as he preferred the 185 c.i.d. Kit. We certainly did not refuse to sell him anything, nor did we change any prices on him. If, and when, we can ever acquire the appropriate pistons, we will once again offer the 185 c.i.d. Kit. Until then, Mr. White has the option of purchasing the 170 Kit, which will perform quite adequately.

Concerning Mr. Swanson's reference—that we wanted \$1200.00 for an Avanti Transmission, after seeing it priced at half that amount earlier, I have insufficient information to deal with the implication of his statement since I do not know when he is referring to by "earlier". The Transmission that we offered for \$1200.00 included a torque converter, which may have not been the case if the Transmission was made available at a lower price, on a previous occasion. I will tell you that we originally had only 3 floor shift, automatic transmissions for the Studebaker Avanti, and now only have I such assembly remaining. We sold I just recently with a torque converter, at a purchase price of \$1500.00, which is not out of line considering what transmissions sell for in today's market and the fact that this particular model transmission may never be produced again by the original manufacturer.

Our prices, as are the prices of any business establishment, are set in accordance with our costs of doing business, our costs of having parts produced, and/or acquiring parts for resale. Certainly anyone expecting price levels in 1986, for Studebaker parts, to be consistent with what they were in 1962, is being unrealistic. Our employees work and live in a 1986 economy and our costs of acquiring parts or having parts put back into production reflect 1986 acquisition costs. Likewise, N.O.S. (new, old stock) parts that we have warehoused for the past 20 years have to bear the accumulated cost of all those years of storage and handling. I think, upon closer examination, you will find our prices to be more than reasonable and further, that we have attempted to treat each of our customers fairly and equitably. Mr. Swanson could have taken advantage of a lower price on the transmission when he had the opportunity. His decision not to should not cast a negative reflection on our firm's efforts to merchandise our wares in such a way so as to fairly price them, cover our overhead, and provide a reasonable return for our investment.

Ms. Wilcoxson, you may feel free to publish my letter in its entirety if you so desire, though I do not feel it is necessary. Further, you may share it with members of the Orlando Area Chapter as I am more than willing to let our track record, in customer fairness, speak for itself in the face of the suggestions that we our involved in deceptive practices.

Paul was born 2/25/25 in Pittsburg. PA where he (of course) excelled in the Public School system until graduation in 1942. He mumbles things about neighbor's '35 Buicks and '32 Pierce Arrows, so it is obvious that even though his family never owned a car, he has been afflicted for quite some time. His dad died on Christmas Day 1933, and if you were around then, you know that things weren't exactly "cool". The necessity to survive led to his selling career which started with Liberty Magazine (5 cents), Saturday Evening Post, newspapers, mom's fresh baked goods, her crocheted items, lawn mowings, etc.

He was so eager to repay Uncle Sam for all his blessings that in early 1943 he put the ink eradicator to his birth certificate and enlisted in the U.S. Army. (2 weeks later he tried to have himself convicted, but no one would listen.) Nearly 3 years later he was fortunate enough to still exist and returned to Pittsburg. Two uncless encouraged him to come to Michigan where they had migrated and found jobs in the steel industry. So he went and did likewise. After a fling of a few years in the steel mill and pick & shoveling for the Gas Company, he decided he wasn't cut out for manual labor. Then, along came Marion, whom he met at the the local church. Before he knew what happened, she had entrapped his mind and body and they were married in January off 1949 (doesn't everyone in the north climes get married in January?).

Shortly thereafter Marion convinced him that a Veteran with a \$39 per week income could do better than install gas lines, and so a new afternoon shift job at the Veterans Hospital and morning classes at the local junior college, and later at Eastern Michigan University, became a way of life. After graduation in 1953 he started teaching Business Studies at a small town high school. Moved once to a larger system for more \$\$ with which to feed Marion and the 4 kids and finally could no longer make a living in teaching, even with the always present part time job or two. (The old car virus struck in 1955 with the purchase of a '13 Ford T. Many others followed and for him, this as been the real fun of it - who would ever want to be "married" to only ONE old car?!)



# Raymond

Monte Carlo, Monaco - Raymond Loewy, whose name was synonymous with American industrial design for decades,

died Monday in Monaco. He was 92. His wife.

Viola, said his death. was due to natura'l causes.

Locwy's designš ranged from appliances to the department

Loewy

stores that sold them, and to trains and ships and the toothbrushes the passengers took along.

His white cigarette package inspired the advertising slogan "Lucky Strike green has gone to war" during World War -II and he designed the rakish "continental" Studebaker car models of the 1960s.

Loewy was born Nov. 5. 1893, in Paris. He served in the French army in World War I and moved to the United States in 1919, beginning his career as a fashion illustrator.

His first major success came in 1934, with a refrigerator for Sears, Roebuck & Co. that used non-rusting shelves for the first time.

Designs for soft drink bottles. ball-point pens, furniture, combs, towels, clocks, office building interiors and almost anything a client could name flowed from its drawing boards.

Throughout his career. he preached the importance of good design.


"Between two products equalin quality, function and price, given comparable promotion. the public will buy more of the one with the better appearance," he said in 1953.

The death of Raymond Loewy on July 14, 1986 brings to an end another chapter in the long and colorful history of the Studebaker Corporation. As Richard M. Langworth noted in his book STUDEBAKER, the POSTWAR YEARS...

"For many years, Raymond Loewy associates would be the only thing standing between Studebaker and dull mediocrity. Aside from the Barney Roos period. Studebaker engineering never achieved the pinnacles of independents like Packard or Hudson. Its styling, before Loewy, had varied widely between the sublime and the silly..."

Raymond Lowey is gone, but his legacy lives on.

Thanks to Frank's effort, each of you received a member profile form to fill out and return, giving us a little more information about you than is on the membership application. To date, only 3 have been received. On tech tips, we usually have to beg, borrow and steal from other newletters, magazine articles, or other publications. Sure would be nice to have some of our own to publish. The committee was very complimentary of the fact that Greasy Prints does contain a lot of original features for that we owe thanks to our Frank Ambrogio, our roving reporter Paul White, and various submissions by some of the other officers including Ruth Wilcoxson as Editor, and Jerry Shelton.

So now Indy is history, and already Estes Park, Colorado for '87 is on our minds. South Bend will again be the site in '88. I was told by a very reliable source (ex-Floridian-but-someday-to-return Linda Sinclair) that this is required every five years. At least we will hopefully have cooler weather in Colorado.




DWIGHT'S 1952 2/R PICKUP



After the meal will be distribution of door prizes donated by local merchants and presentation of awards for restored show cars and unrestored daily driven cars.

This promises to be a fun weekend for everybody, so plan on cranking up those STUDEBAKERS, restored or unrestored, show car or daily transportation, car, truck, or whatever, and head for Vero Beach.

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#### REFLECTIONS

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#### HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

OUR CLUB'S HOUSTON MALL DISPLAY ON JUNE 26-28 AND SEEING MY 1953 STARLIGHT, BOB'S 1957 GOLDEN HAWK, AND ELZA'S 1962 GT HAWK LINED UP IN THE ORDER THEY EVOLVED MADE ME REFLECT BACK ON HOW IT ALL BEGAN.

THE "LOEWY COUPE" WAS DESIGNED BY ROBERT E. BOURKE WHO AT THE TIME WAS CHIEF OF DESIGNERAT RAYMOND LOWEY ASSOCIATES BRANCH IN SOUTH BEND. BOB PERSONALLY STYLED AND DESIGNED THE BODY OF THE 1953 STUDEBAKER COUPE FROM HEADLIGHT TO TAILIGHT, FROM DOOR HANDLE TO DOOR HANDLE, FROM TOP TO BOTTOM. THE 1953 STUDEBAKER WON 17 INTERNATIONAL STYLING AWARDS AND WAS HONORED IN THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART IN NEW YORK AS BEING ONE OF THE GREAT PIECES OF "ROLLING SCULPTURE" OF ALL TIME. IT WAS THE ONLY AMERICAN CAR SO HONORED. THE 1953 STUDEBAKER STARLINER HARDTOP WAS ONE OF THE PIRST CARS RECOGNIZED AS A "MILESTONE CAR" BY THE MILESTONE CAR SOCIETY. ONLY 78,640 COUPES AND HARDTOPS WERE BUILT IN 1953.

THE LOW SALES FIGURES OF 1953 LEFT FEW DOLLARS FOR DESIGN CHANGES, SO THEY WERE HELD TO A MINIMUM FOR 1954 TRIM, GRILL BAR AND TAIL LIGHT CHANGES MADE UP THE TOTAL.

BY THE END OF 1953 IT WAS TIME TO THINK ABOUT THE 1955 LINE UP. LARGE DESIGN CHANGES SEEMED TO BE NEEDED BUT AT THIS TIME THE DOWN HILL PLUNGE OF SALES SINCE 1950 HAD BROUGHT PROFITS TO NEAR ZERO. THE BATTLE FOR "KING OF THE MOUNTAIN" BY FORD AND CHEVROLET HAD CAUSED LEAN YEARS FOR ALL OF THE INDEPENDENTS. BY 1953 STUDEBAKER'S SHARE OF THE MARKET HAD DRIFTED DOWN TO AROUND 5%. STUDEBAKER'S MERGER WITH PACKARD BECAME EFFECTIVE IN OCTOBER OF 1954. THE 1955 DESIGN WAS GREATLY MODIFIED BY THE USE OF HEAVY CHROME IN THE GRILL, SIDE TRIM, AND TAILIGHT HOUSINGS. STUDEBAKER MANAGEMENT HAD A LOT OF INPUT INTO THE DESIGN. MANAGEMENT WAS RUNNING SCARED AT THIS TIME DUE TO LOW SALES AND PROFITS. THE BASIC BODY WAS UNCHANGED.

IN 1956 THE "BOURKE COUPE" BECAME THE HAWK LINE AND THE 1956 HAWK WAS THE ONLY BOURKE DESIGN THAT MADE IT INTO PRODUCTION. FOUR DIFFERENT TRIM AND POWER PACKAGES WERE OFFERED, THE BEST KNOWN BEING THE GOLDEN HAWK. THE 1956 GOLDEN HAWK SHARED THE 352 CI PACKARD ENGINE. THIS WAS CHANGED TO A SUPERCHARGED 289 CI STUDEBAKER ENGINE IN 1957.

THE HAWK LINE CONTINUED WITH MINOR TRIM, ENGINE AND ACCESSORIES CHANGES FROM 1957 to 1961.

WITH SALES LOW AND BUYERS TASTE CHANGING, IT WAS TIME FOR A MAJOR DESIGN CHANGE IN 1962. DID I SAY MAJOR, WELL THE HAWK IS STILL USING THE SAME BASIC "BOURKE COUPE" BODY OF 1953 VINTAGE. OFF COME THE FINS, THE GRILL WAS RESTYLED AND A MAJOR CHANGE IN THE REAR SECTION OF THE ROOF LINE. THESE DESIGN CHANGES WERE RECEIVED WELL, BUT SALES STILL REMAINED LOW. THIS HAWK WAS TO CONTINUE UNTIL THE 1964 MODEL YEAR WITH MINOR TRIM AND ACCESSORIES CHANGES.

THE 12 YEAR PRODUCTION OF THE BASIC DESIGN LIVES UP TO ALL THAT WAS SAID OF IT AT ITS INTRODUCTION BACK IN 1953. THE 1953 STARLIGHT COUPE IS MY PAVORITE BUT I SURE WOULD LOVE TO HAVE ONE OF EACH MODEL, ENGINE, SERIES, AND MAYBE EACH COLOR - OH WELL, I GUESS IT DOESN'T HURT TO WISH.

- \*\* The block color for the 1958 Packard Hawks is an open question. Most reported white, but gold and black have also been reported. One report indicated that the block color matched the exterior body color, but this does not agree with all information provided. Comments please.

Some 1955 reporters indicated a dark green block, but it could have been Alberta Blue, which under certain light looks green.

Except where listed separately, all reports indicated truck engines the same color as regular car engines for the same year. Sometimes cars had engine decals when trucks did not. More on decals later.

### Door Guard

A new portable door guard from Kraco called Prevent-A-Dent gives owners of collector cars the opportunity to park their cars in public parking lots with confidence.

The two inch wide, one inch thick impact-absorbing belt attaches quickly for temporary use. The belt is made of polyurethane foam and has adjustable end straps which adapt to fit most vehicle doors.

Suggested retail for a package of two belts is \$14.95.

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





In December of 1958, I bought a 1956 Chevrolet Bel Air convertible. It was a beautiful car, the exterior was sierra gold with matching gold/beige interior.

As an eighteen year old growing up in the Detroit suburbs, I was very close to the automotive scene. We usually got to see the new models before they were introduced to the public. When you are an eighteen year old with a Chevy Convertible, you realize that a stock car of this type is strictly for the old men out there (over 30). Naturally, to maintain my image, a little customizing was in order.

I know that not everybody was into that sort of thing, so I'll list what was done to the car and then explain the terms as we knew them then.

First, off came the hood and trunk ornaments and the holes then had to be filled with lead (leaded, or nosed and decked).

Second, lowering blocks (shackles) were put on the rear, and the front springs were then torched to compress them. This lowered the front about 1 inch lower than the rear (rake, dago rake in California).

The car already had dual exhausts so all that was needed was some nice sounding glass pack mufflers (pipes).

The tailpipes naturally had to look nice, so on went some chrome exhaust tips (cans).

Now the 1956 Chevy hubcaps were very nice, but this car begged for, and got, spinner type hubcaps from a 1956 Oldsmobile (spinners, or flippers). NOTE: Although stealing these type hubcaps was very common them, a practice known as the "five finger discount", these were obtained legally.

For some reason back then, you were not supposed to see the rear tire (even with the spinners on) so I invested in a pair of 80 inch shark nose shaped fender skirts which "bubbled" out from the body of the car (bubbles).


This car came equipped with dual spotlights, a common accessory at that time, so nothing had to be added there (Twin spots).

So what does all this have to do with the title above? I just wanted to set the stage so you can picture the car and understand the next item.

A car with this image could not go around with ordinary clear parking lights so I removed the parking light lenses and painted them the same color as the car, Sierra Gold. Sierra Gold is a kind of bronze color and when the parking light shines through a lens painted this color, it looks very close to the amber color that parking lights are today (remember this was now 1959).



AMBER parking lights (with white inset)




That's me at the wheel - note the bubble skirts

I drove this car until I sold it in 1962 (for \$650.00) and during this period I was stopped several times by the local law enforcement types who thought their main mission was to give hot rodders like me a hard time. It seems that having parking lights this color was reserved for emergency vehicles only (they insisted that the lights were RED as they saw them through there GREEN sun glasses).

When you are eighteen — twenty years old, you learn that these type people are one dimensional. Their mouths work perfectly, but they seem to suffer terrible hearing problems. They had no trouble SAYING "RED", but just could not HEAR me say that the lights were "AMBER" (actually I called them bronze, but who cares).

I tried being very careful when turning, usually resorting to the then still recognizable hand signals. For a time I even put tin foil between the lens and the bulb so the light would not show through at all. Well, I was able to excape capture until one evening in 1962. I was making a left turn east onto a dead end street, signal flashing (amber of course) into the eyes of the police officer who was turning west. As was the style then, he was wearing GREEN sunglasses and I guess he saw RED.

We both completed our turns but as I looked in my rear view mirror, I could see him whip around and head back \_\_\_\_\_ after me. Since this was a dead end street I had no recourse but to stop and engage in friendly conversation.

I stopped the car and was sitting on the front fender when he arrived with red (not bronze) lights flashing. This was an unmarked 59 Chevy station wagon with the red lights located in the grill and had the new radar equipment on board. I was familiar with that car as it had been around for a few years, but this time I just got caught napping. If it had been a regular police car, naturally I would have spotted it. We all had a knack for that sort of thing you know.

We exchanged a few pleasentries and he left me with a little token of the city's appreciation for my willingness to contribute to the treasury. I sold the car a few months later, with clear parking light lenses. Absolutely ruined the car's appearance.

Anyway, later that year the Detroit auto companies came out with their 1963 lineup and guess what was the new item on every single make and model. Thats right, AMBER PARKING LIGHTS, or RED if you are wearing GREEN tinted sunglasses. I guess some young styling genius, probably working for Ford, must have seen my 56 Chevy and decided that I had a "better idea". He probably received a nice fat bonus for his suggestion. What did I get for coming up with the idea in the first place? A traffic ticket to the tune of five beans (\$5.00).

So now, after almost thirty years, the story is now out on how I came up with the idea of the amber parking light. You probably have never given it a second thought but for me it didn't pay to be AHEAD OF MY TIME.

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
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




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
