

Engine Reflects Major Design Advancement

At first glance the powerplant appears to be a turboprop. But closer inspection reveals none of the characteristics of a typical gas turbine. That is because the engine, called a Dyna-Cam, is a reciprocating engine which departs from the traditional reciprocating engine design.

The Dyna-Cam engine has six double-ended pistons (which fire from both ends) that move parallel to the power shaft. This remarkable engine has 50 percent less moving parts and 75 percent less weight than a comparable powerplant (With the new composites that are now being developed the engine's Power/Weight ratio could be significantly improved). The present design is only 16 inches in diameter and 39 inches long and produces 250 HP (fuel-injected).

The Dyna-Cam engine was first conceived in 1916 by the Blazer brothers, who worked for Studebaker Corporation. The first working model was built and tested in 1940 Dr. Karl Hermann, who also worked for Studebaker. The engine was certified for flight by the FAA in 1957. It is currently being developed by Dyna-Cam Industries, which is run by Ed Palmer, along with his son Dennis and daughter Pat.

The heart of the engine is a fourlobe sinusoidal cam. The pistons are attached to the cam by roller bearings. With six pistons, firing from both ends, the engine achieves 12 power pulses per revolution. Because of the design there is virtually no vibration.


The engine certified by the FAA produced 200 HP and 650 Ft/Lb of torque. The current engine (which is in its fifth generation) generates about 220 HP at 1800 RPM and 800 ft/lb of torque. This torque is comparable to a large diesel truck engine weighing 10 times as much.

In flight tests on a Piper Arrow a rate of climb of 1500 FPM was achieved compared to 900 FPM with the standard piston engine. Take-off distance with the Dyna-Cam engine on the Piper was reduced 40 percent. Testing is still underway with various prop designs but is expected to yield even better performance

The Dyna-Cam has a number of companies that are ready to place orders with the firm. These include Piper, Mooney, Scaled Composites (Burt Rutan's firm), Beech, Volpar and Riley International. However, at this point the company needs funds to go into further testing and full-scale manufacturing.

In addition to the remarkable performance of this engine, it also has lower maintenance costs, is easier to rebuild, has better fuel economy and is competitively priced with a comparable reciprocating engine. While the present design is for aircraft, the engine can adapted for automotive, marine and industrial applications.

THE POISON PEN (EDITORIAL)

In recent months, the controversy has heated up regarding the running of the Studebaker National Museum's 1928 Commander roadster in the 1990 Great American Race. Our SDC national Board of Directors has expressed its opposition (see The Studebaker Almanac column by Richard Quinn in the October 1989 issue of Turning Wheels). They suggest using another car from the Museum collection. The Indy Chapter is opposed to using any car from the collection and has voted "... that if any car in the Studebaker National Museum is used for the Great American Race, the Chapter will not contribute the \$1,000 of the INDY Chapter treasury that was previously set aside for museum support. *.

According to a letter printed in the WLEC's The Driver's Seat, the "Ontario Chapter "is strongly in tavor of the restoration and racing of the Museum '28 Commander". keystone Region chapter members Mike Margerum and Roger Malloy are both in favor of restoring and racing the 1928 Commander.

As I see it, the question is not whether we should/shouldn't race the 1928 Commander (or any other car in the museum). The root of the problem goes much deeper than that.

The name of our club is the Studebaker **Drivers** Club and much is written each year about that emphasized word. On the surface, we seem to admire the person who drives his car to a meet. We even give out awards to the car owner who DROYE the farthest and generally deride the person who trailers his pride and joy.

Do we really believe this or are we just trying to impress everyone? Do go along with it because that is what is expected of us?

I agree that the 1928 Commander is valuable in terms of it's great Studebaker historical significance. I also agree that this car was built for the great American road, and proved it, long before Buick thought of the idea.

Here is a chance to get a truly remarkable car road worthy again and let it compete with the best and we can't agree if that is what we stand for.

Currently this once proud American engineering marvel sits in the National Museum needing a complete restoration. It seems as though we have to make a very tough decision. One which underlies the very heart of our organization.


We can restore this car to its former elegance and as part of the price we can risk having it damaged or even destroyed by running it in the Great American Race. It certainly proved its mettle on its maiden journey. Is there any reason why it couldn't do it again?

In 1949, Studebaker restyled its pickup line with a new postwar look, after totally restyling its line of cars for the '47 season.

The new '49 truck grille was inspired, in part, by the attractive grilles of the beautiful 1947 to 1949 Commander cars by Studebaker, which also includes the Land Cruiser,


The 1950 Studebaker trucks resembled the '49s, but offered the option of overdrive. As, a

1950 advertisement read, "Make. sure of long-lasting, long-range operating economyl Get Studebaker's thrift-assuring overdrive transmission, if you're thinking of buying a new half-ton or three-quarter-ton truck.

"This revolutionary Studebaker forward step in truck engineering is extra cost — but it starts paying its way right away in extra thruit.

"First trucks to offer gas-saving, engine-saving overdrive, Studebaker trucks are also first with real-flift the hood' accessi-



bility to engine — ignition instrument panel wiring. They're America's first trucks, too, with variable-ratio extra leverage steering for easier turnarounds and parking — first trucks with twist-resisting Kmember frame up front." Studebaker also featured an optional "Truck Climatizer" cab heating and ventilating system, the next-best thing to air conditioning in those days. Low cab floor was another Studebaker feature, η



Accelerator plug

Sinclus


• The accelerator plug on the carburetor of your collector car could cause problems if it works loose and falls out of the hole that it fits into.

A missing accelerator plug can lead to a balky engine, which hesitates upon acceleration. Worse yet, it can allow a stream of gasoline to escape from the hole and spray over a hot engine, creating a potential fire hazard.


The plug looks almost like a small rivet. It is held in the side of the carburetor by a force fit. Many mechanics used to remove the plug and connect an air hose to the hole to blow dirt out of the carburetor. If they replaced it too loosely, the owner of a car with a flathead engine was likely to eventually find the plug lying next to a nearby spark plug, on top of the engine's cylinder head.

If your collector car seems to hestitate badly and gives off the smell of gasoline, you may discover that this part is missing from the carburctor. Replacing it is quite simple to accomplish.

Peek at the cylinder head, under your air cleaner and find the missing accelerator plug. Put if back into the little hole and tap it firmly into place with a light hammer.

LUBRICATE AND EASE THE TENSION

Here are a couple of tips for extending the life of your generator.

First and most important is to keep the oiler holes wet. Manual says to squirt 30 weight motor oil every 3 months into the oilers. One thing you can do is let the oil off the dipstick drip in there whenever you check the oil in your engine.

Second, do not over tighten the belt. You only need enough tension to charge the battery. Some bolts are tight enough to tune with a tuning fork. If you keep that much tension on the belt plan on replacing the bushings more often. Easy does it when using a lever to adjust the generator or alternator belt.

Third, watch the brushes for wear. You can replace the brushes much easier and cheaper than the armature. A stingy drop of oil on the brush tension springs will prevent them from rusting in place if the car is stored or seldom driven. Lubriplate or silicone grease is suggested to prevent seizing of brush tension springs of stored cars.

CYLINDER HEAD TEST

If you are losing water through the overflow pipe, this little tip might help you find the source.

To test the cylinder head, cylinder head gasket, and cylinder block for air or gas leaks, place a hose on the overflow pipe and into a bottle filled with water. Replace the radiator pressure cap with a straight cap and run the engine at 2600 RPM for at least a minute. The presence of bubbles in the water bottle will indicate air leaking into the cooling system. Remove the fan belt and again run the engine at about 2600 RPM. If the bubbles continue to form, the cylinder head gasket is probably leaking. If the bubbles stop when the fan belt is removed an air leak at the hose connection or the water pump is indicated.


Our next breakfast meeting will be Oct 28th, at Frisch's Big Boy on Lee Road.

Meeting adjourned at 8:00 followed by coffee and ''Dirt cake'', a novel and very delicious desert by Lou Elliott.


